

### THE WORD THIS WEEK

Today's Gospel continues the theme of love and friendship to which Jesus is calling us. But He also wants us to be full of joy: 'that my own joy may be in you'. It will be the visible evidence of the Holy Spirit working inside us. This joy is deeper and more significant than mere happiness.
